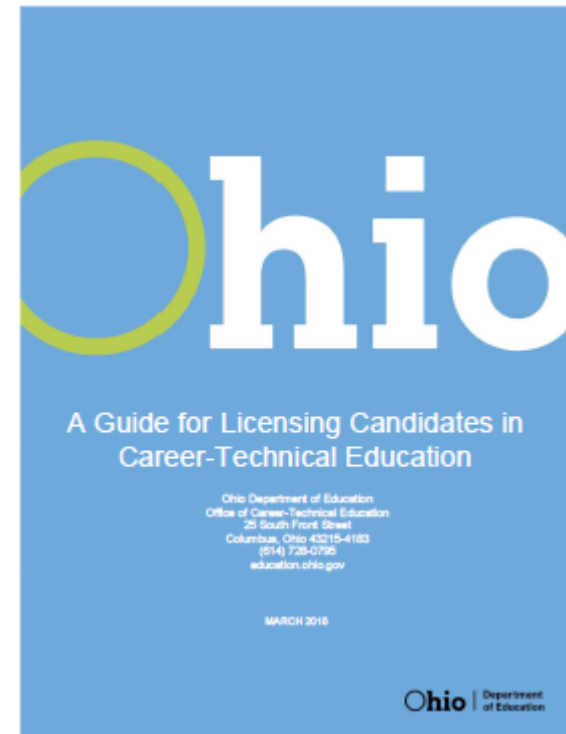

Teacher Licensure- Resident Educator (RE)

Most Teachers' Preparation Experience:

- Undergraduate College Courses
- Student Teaching
- Degree
- Licensure  Resident Educator

Teacher preparation programs may be offered in the following areas:

- Agriculture
- Integrated Business
- Family and Consumer Sciences (FCS)
- Marketing
- Technology Education

Career-Technical Teacher Licensure:

Alternative Resident Educator (Alt-RE)

To be eligible for Alt-RE pathway, the individual must:

- Hold a minimum of a high school diploma
- Evidence five years of full-time work experience or equivalent in the career field
- Complete 24 semester hours of post-secondary courses

- 1) Approved teacher preparation program *and*
- 2) Performance Based Assessment *and*
- 3) Four years of teaching under the Alt-RE license, *and*
- 4) Licensure plan and portfolio, if applicable

Alt-RE Application Process

Complete the [CTE-36](#) Qualification Form

- 1) 5 years of industry experience in career field
- 2) Baccalaureate or Master's degree in the content area – 2 years of related work experience
- 3) Associate degree in the content area – 3 years of related work experience
- 4) Successful completion of a secondary career-technical two-year program – 4 years of related work experience

Alt-RE Application Process

Panel of Experts

- Candidate does not provide evidence of five years of full-time work experience
- Determine if the candidate has the necessary subject knowledge and skills to teach the career-technical courses under consideration

Alt-RE Application Process

Complete the [CTE-37](#) Teacher Eligibility and Verification

- 1) Electronic submission of document
- 2) Must include electronic signatures
- 3) Email CTE-37 to the university where the applicant will complete the 24 semester hours of career-technical coursework.
- 4) Applicant uploads the CTE-37 with all signatures into CORE

Teacher Licensure- Supplemental for Career- Technical Workforce Development

To be eligible for a Supplemental License for Career-Technical Workforce Development, the individual must:

- Be hired by a school district in the subject area designated on the CTE-37 and Supplemental License
- Hold a valid Ohio resident educator, professional, permanent, or five-year career-technical teaching license;
- Shows evidence of five years of full-time work experience in the career field;
- Complete an approved preservice career-technical education program at an approved university (12 semester hours)

**To renew an initial
Supplemental

Development, the
individual must:**

- 1) Complete six of the 12 semester hours of coursework *and*
- 2) Maintain the valid Ohio resident educator, professional, permanent or five-year career-technical teaching license

Teacher Licensure- Supplemental for Career- Technical Education

To be eligible for a Supplemental License for Career-Technical Education, the individual must:

- Be hired by a school district in the subject area designated on the CTE-37 and Supplemental License
- Hold a valid Ohio resident educator, professional, permanent, or five-year career-technical teaching license
- Hold a baccalaureate degree

To be eligible for a Supplemental License for Career-Technical Education, the individual must:

- Pass the content-knowledge test for one of the following areas:
 - Agriculture
 - Integrated Business
 - Family and Consumer Sciences (FCS)
 - Marketing
 - Technology Education
- Request a transcript review from an approved university or from the Ohio Department of Education
